July Sunday Services

June 7, 2019 • "One Nation, Indivisible?" • Rev. Duffy Peet

"I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." These are the words of the pledge of allegiance written by Francis Bellamy in 1892. It seems today that our nation is in a time of fragmentation and division, a time when liberty and justice are for some, but not for all. Looking to our Seven Principles how might we find ways to promote wholeness and unity?

July 14, 2019 • "A Coffee Shop Epiphany" • Guest Speaker: Rev. Kali DeHart

Rev. Kali DeHart plans to speak about the interplay between wisdom and spirituality. Some things really do get better with age. I hope you will join for conversation with our visiting minister from Sheridan, WY.

July 21, 2019 • "Spirituality and Religious Tolerance in Mongolia" • Guest Speaker: Dr. Cliff Montagne

Dr. Cliff Montagne, Professor Emeritus at Montana State University, has worked extensively with the people of Mongolia. He will share his observations on their rich spiritual history and religious diversity, which was influenced by Genghis Khan. Khan practiced a type of shamanism characterized by a strong connection and reverence for the natural world. As Khan expanded the empire, he was influenced by and tolerant of Buddhism, Islam, Christianity and Daoism. Genghis Khan is the subject of the current exhibit at the Museum of the Rockies.

July 28, 2019 • "Everyday Enlightenment" • Guest Speaker: Rev. Lyn Stangland Cameron

We UU's look to the eighteenth century "Enlightenment," and the birth of the age of reason for many of our UU roots. However, "enlightenment" has other faces, other meanings and other sources. It was Elizabeth Dodson Gray's "Sacred Dimensions of Women's Experience" and the writings of Thich Nhat Hahn that validated my personal experience that everyday chores and mundane tasks can be accomplished in a spiritually satisfying and enlightening manner. In this era of great challenge, distress and confusion let's spend this midsummer hour exploring and appreciating an enlightenment that is accessible each day. Rev. 
UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY

On June 8th, the new UUFB Board of Directors enjoyed a well-presented **Board Retreat** that was prepared and facilitated by members of the new Governance and Leadership Committee. This was a great introduction and a useful bonding opportunity for all the members of the Board.

On June 9th, the Hospitality and Membership Committee held their first Sunday morning Newcomers **Breakfast.** After noshing on yogurt and fruit and breads, the newcomers were asked to give their views about their orientation and welcome to the Fellowship. The summary of their comments will be reviewed by Hospitality and Membership as well as the Board, as we are eager to learn how to build community with the aid of our newest members. Of particular note, new members reported feeling a little lost in the system, not understanding our organizational structure. This is a concern that even long-time members have expressed. To that end, the Communications Committee has asked Susan Anderegg, our volunteer graphic designer extraordinaire, to produce an **Organizational Chart** that we will be displaying on a wall in the building sometime this summer. We will be printing this resource in smaller size for distribution as well.

That Sunday, June 9th, was the Program Council's first meeting of the Program year during which committee chairs and task force leaders reported on their respective groups' doings. Peg Wherry, Vice President of the Board, will be convener for the Program Council's meetings 2019-2020.

This month, Mike Clark provided a training in use of the **new video projector** to several members. Our audio-visual contractor has provided a system that is quite easy for trained members to use with various types of computers. We are especially pleased with the high resolution of the video now available.

During June, members contacted the Board with strong feelings and questions about UUFB's standing with the LGBTQ+ community. As was pointed out, we promote our position as a Welcoming Community, but there is no visible indication of that, nor have we participated in events of late that would show support for this vulnerable population. This was a good wake-up call to the Board. We now have a member of the congregation investigating applying for the UUA's "Welcoming Renewal." This is a process that will require we abandon our complacency and help us address how we can do a better job of showing up for the LGBTQ+ community.

We gave our thanks to our Nursery Caregiver, Katrina Bianchini, who tendered her resignation the first week of June because she recently procured a full-time job that would prevent her availability on Sunday Mornings. The Board agreed to a proposal made by RE Coordinator Marie Lynn to hire two UUFB teenagers, Faila and Marissa Bianchini, to assist adult volunteers and Marie with children's classes during Sunday services this summer. A new nursery caregiver will be hired to begin work in September.

As most of you know, our current part-time pianist Erin Henke will be playing her last service on August 4th. We have watched Erin grow as a musician since she started working for us as a high school student. On August 7th she and her husband Logan will leave Bozeman so she may pursue a Master's degree in Collaborative Piano at Longy University in Cambridge, MA. We will miss her talent, her passion and her devotion to UUFB.

Instead of finding another part-time pianist to replace Erin, the Board has voted to hire long-time member and well-known pianist Laurel Yost to serve as a full-time pianist. We are blessed to be able to enjoy the talents of such a fine musician as Laurel and look forward to what she will bring to Sunday morning music!

Ten people from Bozeman attended the **UUA General Assembly** in Spokane that took place June 19th-23rd. At a recent debriefing meeting, attendees reported experiencing inspiration, frustration, joy, outrage over issues, and gratitude for the diverse body of UU members and skilled leaders we were exposed to in Spokane. We brought home a huge number of new ideas and resources that will help us continue to grow in size and in spirit. We also brought back lots of new books for our library and a great appreciation for the UUFB congregation, who seem so cohesive and loving and welcoming. Look for a display in the Social Hall soon of General Assembly Happenings!

If you want to participate, but can't dig and shovel, you can donate to UUFB "landscape" in the memo line. 2 yards of soil and parts for the drip line will cost about \$175.

Wednesday, July 10th: 5-7 p.m. - add new soil/compost, bring shovel and gloves

Thursday, July 11th: 5-7 p.m. - prepare the soil for planting
