REVEREND REFLECTIONS

REV. MARGO RINEHART

It was with great enthusiasm that I recently told Reverend Lois Van Leer how much I was looking forward to serving as your Interim Minister. For any of you newer to UUFB, Reverend Lois served as your minister over a decade ago. Upon hearing my proclamation, Reverend Lois smiled widely, gestured with a full extension of her arms and said, "tell them how much I love them! They taught me so much!" We mused together that while ministers will come and go, congregations stand steady in their history, mission, and care for individuals and the wider community. UUFB is such a place, and I am excitedly looking forward to serving as your minister in this liminal time.

During the search process back in May of 2022, after reading your congregational record and talking with some people within the UUA who already knew you, UUFB rose to the top of my interest list. I noted the relationality across generations, depth of commitment, care expressed in mission, and ongoing quest for meaning-making. Let me also add, you all also seemed to know how to play together as well! Almost immediately I felt certain that my skills and your history would coalesce into a productive and purposeful interim time together grounded in care and vision. Most of you are probably having that normal wondering what to expect during our time together.

While every congregation is different, there are some core tasks in the interim ministry time[1]. We will work together to:

- Claim and honor the past, including joys, milestones, grief, and conflicts.
- Illuminate your unique identity of needs, strengths and challenges.
- Clarify the multiple dimensions of leadership, both ordained and lay.
- Renew connection with recourses available from the Unitarian Universalist Association.
- Understand and participate in the UUA's efforts at anti-racism/anti-oppression work.
- Renew vision, strengthen stewardship, and prepare for the next called minister.
- Prepare and commit to the next direction.

Together, we will also build relationship, worship, play, and work to help heal our world. My heart beats faster with every day that I am closer to arriving in Bozeman, meeting you all, and hearing your dreams for UUFB. Let us teach and learn from one another!

It moves beyond just facts about anatomy and human development, to help participants clarify their values, build interpersonal skills, and understand the spiritual, emotional, and social aspects of sexuality. We know that offering holistic sexuality education programs can change lives.

The Board of Directors met on July 11 for the regular monthly meeting with continuing members and two new board members. COVID UPDATE – Cases continue to rise in Gallatin County. Remember, masks are still required indoors to protect yourself and others from this highly infectious Covid variant. Spacing between people continues to be important. We will continue to stay current with an updated recommendation by the Gallatin Health Department. Meanwhile, thank you so much for your patience and support.

AIR FILTRATION SYSTEM - You may have noticed we now have a portable air filtration system to help mitigate the spread of Covid inside the building. The system will run during our Sunday services. If you are meeting in the building, you may turn on the system, being sure to turn it off before you leave.

Now is a good time to plan some outdoor or small group, social events that will also bring some income to the UUFB. 

The interdependent web—expressed as the spirit of life, the ground of all being, the oneness of all existence, the community-forming power, the process of life, the creative force, even God—can help us develop that social understanding of ourselves that we and our culture so desperately need. It is a source of meaning to which we can dedicate our lives."
