September 11, 2022 • "Frances Perkins and the New Deal for Labor" • Lay Presenter: Peg Wherry

In September we observe Labor Day, which is a good time to acknowledge the path-breaking work of Frances Perkins, the first woman cabinet member, and Franklin Delano Roosevelt's Secretary of Labor. She is probably more responsible than anybody for the New Deal, which was only a campaign slogan when FDR asked her to serve in his cabinet. Her agenda included minimum wage, maximum hours, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation, Social Security, National Labor Relations Board, and the end of child labor. Her commitment to women, children, and working people grew from deep moral and spiritual values and is still inspiring.

True belonging is the spiritual practice of believing in and belonging to yourself so deeply that you can share your most authentic self with the world... true belonging doesn't require you to change who you are; it requires you to be who you are." Brene' Brown

A deep heartfelt thank you to all of you for inviting me to belong to this congregation. Your notes, gifts, emails, and in-person greetings were outstretched arms of welcome. Not only appreciation and welcome but an invitation to explore our relationship more deeply as we, both congregant and minister, share our hopes, wishes, and dreams for UUFB.

During September we will be exploring what it means to belong. Belonging is so essential, the capacity for connection with other humans is part of our DNA. We must share ourselves with others or our very existence is threatened. Writer, Douglas Steer, advises us to ask "Whose am I? Who needs you? Who loves you? To whom are you accountable? Whose life is altered by your choices?" We will also look at the costs of not belonging and ask ourselves what we can do to support those who fight to be seen. People of color and people who identify as LGBTQ have often felt the pressure that society creates for them (us) to fit into the dominant society. There are crushing mental and physical health consequences of being pushed to the margins. What is our personal and collective responsibility in creating a Beloved Community rather than an exclusionary one? Engage in this time of exploring belonging and find out what the journey is for you and your community.



Remembering Past Members



Gordon R. Julian was born to J. Frank Julian and Clara (Smith) Julian in Wenatchee, WA, on May 29, 1928. Gordon died at home in Bear Canyon on May 20, 2022.

He graduated from the University of Utah in 1950 with a degree in Zoology and received a Ph.D. in Chemistry in 1960 from the University of Oregon. From 1960–64, he did post graduate studies as a Research Associate at the Dept. of Pharmacology, Harvard Medical School. He was Professor, Dept. of Chemistry, Montana State University, 1964–1987. In 1974–75 he was a U.S. National Academy of Sciences Research Fellow, Biological Research Center, Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Szeged, Hungary. From 1975 to 1976 he was Visiting Professor at the Frederich Miescher Institute, Basel, Switzerland. After retiring from MSU, he was visiting Professor, Dept. of Biochemistry at Louisiana State University 1987–89.

In 1952, Gordon married Phyllis McMahon. They had two daughters, Nancy and Janet. After their divorce, he married Sara Williams in 1975. They were married for 47 years.


All of Gordon's adult life he was a Unitarian Universalist. He was the oldest living member of the Bozeman Unitarian Universalist Fellowship. He was devoted to the denomination for its work and voice on social justice issues.

<u>Paul William McVey</u>, 72 years old, left this world much too soon after a year long struggle with brain cancer (Glioblastoma). He passed away on July 27th at home while surrounded by his loving family and friends.

He was born in Pittsburgh, PA on August 13, 1949, to John William McVey and Ruth Klose McVey. Paul spent his formative years in the suburbs of Cincinnati. He went on to attend Ohio University where he received a B.A. in Journalism in 1971.

After graduation from college, Paul worked several jobs but soon became restless and developed a desire to see the world. So he joined the Peace Corps in 1975 serving as a volunteer in Tunisia. While in Tunisia, he picked up some Arabic, a love for travel, and the woman who was to become his Peace Corps bride, Kristine Fagrelius McVey. After the Tunisia assignment they relocated to Bangladesh where they were married in Dhaka on December 10, 1977.



Over the next 40+ years Paul and Kristine lived in Bangladesh, Congo, Yemen, Sudan, Egypt (4x!), Russia, West Bank/Gaza, China, India, Afghanistan (3x), Indonesia, Mexico and capped it off with a stint in Germany. In addition, Paul did short term contracts in Haiti, Malawi, Romania, Jordan and Moldova. While overseas, Paul and Kristine had three children: Alexa, Kaitlin, and Galen, along with a healthy number of dogs. Paul spent his working career in International Development with a focus on Operations, Finance and Grant Management. He was a true Nomad (or World Traveler).

After retiring back to Bozeman, Paul became an active member of the Unitarian Church and the Buddhist Dharma Center. The memorial service for Paul will be held on Saturday, October 1st, 2 p.m. at UUFB. Please RSVP at https://tinyurl.com/UUFBmemorials.
