June 4, 2023 • "What Can We Do?" • Barbara Amaral, Alexandra Lin, and Brandi Johnson

We hope for a world of love, but it will not come without witnessing, understanding, and action. Door-to-door distribution of anti-Semitic literature, death threats to MSU's BIPOC and LGBTQ+ students, and the continuing disappearance and murder of indigenous women call us to respond. Barbara Amaral (Temple Beth Shalom), Alexandra Lin (MSU APPI & LGBTQIA+), and Brandi Johnson (UM/Crow Salish Blackfeet) will share their experiences and perspectives to help us learn how we can be effective allies and advocates.

June 11, 2023 • "The Creative Spirit" • by Rev. Janet Parsons - Read by Neil Gregersen

Rev. Parsons once had the good fortune to be present when someone was struck by a creative spirit, and had the chance to watch what happened. The someone was her husband. They were participating in a prayer group at their home congregation, and had been given time to write: to explore writing a prayer or a reflection, to see what might emerge.

June 18, 2023 • "Father's Day: Stories about Parenting as a Black Father" • Dr. Jelani Mahiri This service will be held in person only at Bozeman Pond. Hear stories of our humanity through the experiences of fathering and the complexities of parenting children in today's society, especially children of color. Dr. Mahiri is a Visiting Professor in Anthropology at MSU since 2009, who has a wide range of life experiences. He speaks from the heart with empathy, broad perspectives, and humor in his narratives. He is also a photographer and engages in Afro-Cuban percussion and dance. In the summers he works in landscaping, which has led to his planting of at least 1,000 trees in Bozeman and throughout the Gallatin Valley. Don't miss this special service.

June 25, 2023, <u>9 a.m.</u> • "Ever Willing: Becoming the People Our World Needs" • Rev. Manish Mishra-Marzetti This will be a live stream of the UU General Assembly Sunday service. It will be held at 9 a.m. MDT. The pandemic has wrought change and created uncertainty for institutions, like our Unitarian Universalist congregations, and our wider world. Who and what are we becoming, individually and collectively? Our GA Sunday service explores these themes as we gather in community to celebrate the best of who we UUs are.

Born and raised in Pittsburgh, Rev. Mishra-Marzetti serves as Senior Minister of the First UU of Ann Arbor, MI. He is a co-editor of "Conversations with the Sacred: A Collection of Prayers" (2020) and the 18-19 UUA common read, "Justice on Earth: People of Faith Working at the Intersections of Race, Class, and the Environment." He has served extensively in UU leadership. He brings to the ministry his multicultural experience serving as a U.S. diplomat during the Clinton administration. Rev. Manish loves desert hiking and his amazing kids and husband.

REVEREND REFLECTIONS REV. MARGO RINEHART

"What was it like to look into the face of hate, I mean up close and personal?" someone in my family asks. They ask this because I posted a photo and did some messaging on our closed media site. At the Bozeman Pride Stroll I was caught on the street, up close, but certainly not personally, with a counter Pride group who were trying to bring their angry, hateful messaging into the gathering. Most of us did not perceive them as having an actual message. While they shouted untruths about transgender people, to our ears it seemed mechanical and just random words connected to nothing. It was easy to turn our backs because the words were inconsequential. What was real was the singing, dancing, smiling and laughter of those of us in the Pride Stroll and Block Party. When dark shirts and covered faces showed up, we could not be bothered to hear them. There were so many reasons for happiness, love and delight we moved back to the joyful business of celebrating the beauty of life, the beauty of one another. The succulent, tasty feast that is our life together. I hope that all who gathered on Saturday, and those of you who sent us love even though you could not be there in person, are still delighting in the love that flows out like light spilling across the grass on a warm summer morning.



TRANSITIONTALK

On May 7, the Transition Team led a workshop "Shape the Future," attended by about two dozen members and friends. They shared ideas on where we might build and re-build as we re-energize after COVID isolation and prepare for a new minister. Attendees separated into three groups, each addressing one of the three core areas described below to focus our work in the next 15 months.

- Governance and Leadership This system focuses on how decisions are made, how the Board and the
 congregation see the Board's role, how (and how easily) are individuals recruited into leadership roles,
 whether leaders are "recycled" and new members invited into leadership, what opportunities there are for
 leadership training.
- Connection and Engagement This system includes how we welcome visitors and build membership, what the pathway to membership is, how members and friends connect with each other outside of Sunday services, and how we meet the needs of a multigenerational congregation.
- Religious Education and Theological/Spiritual Grounding This is about how we provide religious
 education or exploration for all ages, who teaches, how regional and UUA resources are utilized, whether we
 have a safe congregation policy, and how children and youth are included in Sunday services.

Many useful suggestions and stimulating ideas were shared during the workshop; the Transition Team is now digesting all that information. We say a heartfelt "thank you" to everyone who participated!

As we move into the summer months, the Transition Team is at the half-way point of UUFB's interim ministry. We are reviewing and tweaking our team's mission statement as we move beyond the information-gathering phase. We'll share that clarification of our mission in future newsletters.

Finally, we say good-bye this month to Cami Armijo-Grover, who is taking her "Transition" work to the next stage by serving on the Search Committee for our next Settled Minister. She serves UUFB well through many efforts.
