# Movie Night: "The Singing Revolution" - January 26

The Social Justice Action Committee will host a free showing of the documentary "The Singing Revolution," an inspiring film tracing the role of singing in the Estonian independence movement from 1987 – 1991. Estonia, which achieved independence from the Soviet Union with no bloodshed, had a "song festival" tradition dating from 1869, attracting crowds of hundreds of thousands and combined choirs of 20,000 or more on stage. In the age of *glasnost* (openness), singing became a unifying and energizing form of national resistance. Estonia is now a member of NATO and the European Union, thus a key US ally. The film will be shown at the Fellowship at 5:00 p.m. on January 26, 2025. There can be discussion afterwards for those so inclined. Handouts and light refreshments will be provided. (Beverages must be in screw-top bottles or seal-able travel mugs.)
