The Social Justice Action Committee (SJAC) has specified that this offering will go to the Modern Day Warrior Movement. Donate online (<u>uufbozeman.org/donate</u>) and select "Give to 2nd Sunday charitable donation" or write a check payable to UUFB with "modern" in the memo line.

In 2015, Poplar resident Isaac Miller, an enrolled member of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, Pine Ridge, SD, established the Modern Day Warrior Movement to assist young individuals in achieving sobriety and engaging in community volunteer work. Since its inception, the organization has sponsored cultural camps, horseback rides, prayer walks, and prayer caravans, in addition to participating in community clean-up initiatives, lawn maintenance for the elderly and disabled, and providing traditional and cultural teachings, including weekly sweat lodge ceremonies. Currently, Modern Day Warriors are providing meals to homeless individuals and community members every Sunday from 1-5 pm at the Poplar Cultural Center. Their only support for these services comes from the community of Poplar who donate food, supplies, and winter gear. As an independent grassroots entity, they welcome individuals from all backgrounds to share a meal. A local non-profit organization, Indian Child and Family Resource Center, helps process donations to the Modern Day Warrior Movement. One hundred percent of donations will go to Modern Day Warriors.
